

TULA FIREPIT- CARE AND USE INSTRUCTIONS

Thank you for purchasing a Tula Firepit. Originating from northern India they are used as large cooking pots at festivals and weddings as well as for general day to day cooking. The tried and tested design has not changed for centuries with riveted plates or large sheets of steel formed into a bowl and fitted with strong carrying handles.

Contents: Bowl with drainage filter, Stand + Tongs (N.B. not designed for food use)

How to use your Tula Firepit:

1. Place your Kadai Firebowl on a level surface.
2. Before lighting your Kadai, cover the bottom evenly with 2cm to 5cm of Kadai beads. Using beads have a number of benefits:
 - Beads filter out the fine ash particles when it rains.
 - Beads will retain the heat for longer.
 - Beads insulate some of the heat to prevent burning the ground under the Kadai (especially useful for wooden decking and grass).
 - Also, wood burns better on beads than directly on the metal.

For your safety:

1. Do not use indoors! The Firepit is for outdoor use only. If used indoors, carbon monoxide will accumulate and cause serious injury or death. Do not use in a garage, building or enclosed area. Do not use under any overhead combustible construction.
2. CAUTION! Do not use spirit or petrol for lighting or re-lighting! Use only firelighters complying with EN 1860-3.
3. ATTENTION! This firepit will become very hot, do not move it during operation.
4. WARNING! Keep children and pets away.

Care and maintenance of your Kadai:

We would recommend the following care and maintenance

- Your fire bowl will take on a natural rust finish; this is part of the character of the bowl.
- Periodically use wire wool on the bowl, stand and tongs to remove any loose rust.
- Regular oiling of the bowl with vegetable oil will help to keep it in good condition.
- We recommend that fire bowls are stored inside during the winter.
